

Safe Places Scheme

Safe Places is a national scheme that helps vulnerable people feel confident and safe while out and about.

If someone is lost, anxious, confused, feels they are being abused or harassed while they are out they can go a designated Safe Place.

Safe Places offer support to elderly people, people with dementia, those who may have a physical or learning disability, people with mental health needs or someone who feels unwell.

Safe Places are identified by a nationally recognised logo that is visible on a window sticker that could be in shops, community centres, libraries or cafes.



People who want to be part of the scheme can carry cards with useful contact numbers on for family members or a helpline. A member of staff can then phone the number on the card. If people do not have a card they can still ask for assistance.
