

We have received a grant from the Community Covenant Fund to provide a reception area downstairs at the Town Hall so that people can search for jobs and receive initial support during office hours. The Town Council is taking this opportunity to develop the services it offers to make them more accessible. Plans are currently being drawn up for the necessary building work.

Making a New Market Square

Following a review of the future of town centres by Mary Portas, the Government has launched a fund to set up Town Teams to improve the high streets in their towns. The Carterton Fast Forward Partnership, with the support of the Town Council, is applying to this fund, to refurbish and remodel the area outside the Town Hall and to make pedestrian links between the Morrisons and Aldi sites and the town centre. We believe it is important to help all the shops capitalise on the increased footfall in the town. Some illustrative plans can be seen on our website—www.carterton-tc.gov.uk/ff_centre. If funding is secured there will be a full public consultation.
